EDWARD BANTING was born in 1836 in Upper Clatford, Hampshire, son of Joseph and Sarah (Churcher) Banting. A farm worker like his father, he remained in Upper Clatford until at least 1861. We have yet to find him in the census of 1871 but he was living by 1881 in Barton Stacey as a lodger in the home of Hannah (Ball) Ralph, widow of Charles Rolfe/Ralph of Barton Stacey. They married later in 1881, she by then carrying his child. They remained in Hannah's home in one of Fennell's Cottages in Barton Stacey village (part of what is now called The Gardens). Edward Banting died in Barton Stacey in 1911, Hannah in 1915. **A son**,

William Thomas, born 8 July 1881. He was a farm worker in Barton Stacey who was living at the time of the 1939 Register at Chalk Dell with the Hoare family.
 Willie Thomas Banting died in 1963 aged 81 and was buried at Barton Stacey on 2 January.
